Exhibits may be sent by prepaid mail or express to the Superintendent or delivered to the Sugar House between 7 am and Noon Friday, August 27. Judging will start at 1 pm Friday, August 27. The exhibitor's name must not be attached to the entry. Only commercial containers, as listed by class, may be used.

All articles in this competition must be produced by the exhibitor during the existing season.

All exhibits become the property of the Exposition.

Classes

1. Extracted light honey in one pound glass jars.
2. Extracted amber honey in one pound glass jars.
3. Extracted dark honey in one pound glass jars.
4. Creamed honey.
5. Chunk honey in one pound glass jars or in three pound canning type jars.
6. Comb honey in round or square sections
7. Cut comb in clear plastic trays.

Prizes for classes 1 through 7 are 1st, \$10; 2nd \$8, 3rd \$6, and Merit Award, \$5. For all classes, where there is no contest, only Merit Award will be made, if worthy.
